

*plicated, or tangled, so as to be like felt (M, Mgh) upon the ground; (M;) it has many joints, or knots, and short internodal portions; and scarcely, or never, grows anywhere but over water, or in a place beneath which is water; (M, Mgh;) and it is one of the plants that are regarded as indicative of the existence of water:*

n. un. with *ē*: (M:) Lth says that the *ثِيل* is a certain plant that tangles upon the ground: Th, on the authority of IAqr, says that it is a kind of plant said to be that called *لَحِيَّةُ التَّيْسِ*: and Sh says that the *ثِيلَة* is a green small tree [or plant] resembling the first shoots that come forth from grain. (T.)

*ثَيْلٌ*: see *ثِيلٌ*, in two places.

*أَثِيلٌ* A camel large in the *ثِيل*; (T, S, M, K;) wide therein: (M:) pl. *ثَيْلٌ*. (K.)

*مَثِيلَةٌ* A place in which is the kind of plant called *ثِيلٌ*. (Mgh.)
