is an elliptical and abridged phrase, meaning The people, or company of men, assembled themselves in the فَيْظ [or summer]. (TA.)

What is brought forth [of sheep or goats] in the season called the قَيْظَى. (K, TA.) [See nlso صَعْرِيّ , in three places.]

Seed-produce [or wheat] that is sown in the autumn and the beginning of winter [so as to be reaped in summer]. (JK, TA.)

A day vehemently, or intensely, hot: | a means of subsistence for the camels when other a summer vehement, or intense [in heat]. (TA.)

A place where people remain, or abide, in the summer; (IAar, S, K;) as also مُقْيَظُ (K.) And A place of pasturing in summer. (IAar.) \_\_ Also, (JK,) or مُقيظُةٌ للهِ, (K,) A plant, or herbage, that remains green until the قَيْظ [or summer], (Lth, JK, K,) although the land and leguminous plants he dried up, (Lth, TA,) being

herbage has become dry. (Lth, JK, K.)
